

Code of conduct form

Youth Weekend Retreat 2017

All individuals participating in March of Dimes Canada and Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital group services such as the Youth Weekend Retreat are expected to behave in a manner which is deemed by society at large to be acceptable and appropriate for young adults in a public setting.

Behaviour which is considered unacceptable may consist of, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- Shoving, hitting, touching, or any other form of unwelcome physical contact
- Sexual comments or gestures
- Being under the influence of an illegal substance
- Possession of an illegal substance
- Intoxication

Any object which could be used as or considered as a weapon (i.e., knives) must not be brought to the program.

Should a participant's behaviour during the Youth Weekend Retreat be deemed inappropriate by March of Dimes Canada and Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital staff, the participant may be asked to immediately leave and return home.

The role of the activity group facilitator is to assist the group **as a whole** in order to provide a positive experience. If a significant level of individual assistance or support is required, **participants must make their own arrangements for that individualized support**. While staff is always available to the participants, it **does not provide 24 hour or 1 on 1 supervision**.

Participants are required to show respect for other participants and their property and will be held responsible for any damages to the person or property of others which result from their actions while participating in group meetings or activities.
