Day 1 – Foundations of Family Intervention After Brain Injury

Workshop Objectives:

- Learn clinical intervention strategies, case problem solving, and evaluation techniques

Day 1 - Foundations of Family Intervention After Brain Injury

- How children, adolescents, parents, and families are impacted by pediatric ABI
- Overview of Cognitive Behavioral Therapy Framework
- Family Systems Theory
- Solution Focused Rehabilitation
- Getting the Big Picture Assessment and intervention
- Assessment and engagement strategies with adolescents and families
- Measures and therapeutic change
- Successful strategies for interacting with families after ABI
- Working with complex family situations
- Objectively evaluating change and therapeutic benefit

Day 2 - BIFI/BIFI-A (Brain Injury Family Intervention): An Evidence-Based Approach

Through small group interactive sessions, role play, vignettes and video-tapes, clinicians will learn how to the implement BIFI (Brain Injury Family Intervention for families of adults with ABI) or BIFI-A (Brain Injury Family Intervention for families of adolescents with ABI) programs. **BIFI-A is now accepted as a Leading Practice by Accreditation Canada.**

Completion of Day 1: Foundations of Family Intervention After Brain Injury is a pre-requisite.

Workshop Objectives:

- Learn about a structured approach and practical tools for working effectively with families after adult <u>or</u> pediatric ABI
- Training for the implementation of the BIFI or BIFI-A protocol.

Day 2 - BIFI/BIFI-A (Brain Injury Family Intervention): An Evidence-Based Approach

Participants will choose to attend **either** the BIFI intensive for families of adults **or** the BIFI-A intensive for families of adolescents. **Both BIFI/BIFI-A workshops include a Treatment Manual and Intervention Kit that:**

- Focuses on skill building, psychosocial support, and education about ABI.

- Draws upon family discussion, vignettes, role plays and interactive exercises.

- Brain Injury happens to the whole family
- Being a teen and achieving independence
- Emotional and physical recovery
- Coping with loss and change
- Managing intense emotions
- Managing stress and taking care of self
- Setting s.m.a.r.t. goals and tracking progress
- Learning patience and solving problems
- School and transition planning

Caron Gan, RN, MScN, AAMFT Clinical Fellow & Approved Supervisor, Clinical Team Investigator, Bloorview Research Institute, Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital. Caron Gan is an RN, a Certified Clinical Traumatologist, and a Marriage and Family Therapist, registered with the Ontario and American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. For the past 23 years, she has worked with clients with ABI providing psychotherapeutic intervention to youth, adults, couples and families in both public and private sectors. Caron's research focuses on family interventions after pediatric ABI. She is lead author and primary developer of BIFI-A.

Jeffrey S. Kreutzer, Ph.D., ABPP is a Professor of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Neurosurgery, and Psychiatry at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU), Medical College of Virginia Campus.

Dr. Kreutzer serves as Director of Virginia's federally designated Traumatic Brain Injury Model System and coordinates VCU Health System outpatient services for families and persons with brain injury. Dr. Kreutzer is a neuropsychologist and family therapist with more than two decades experience developing and implementing brain injury family support services. Dr. Kreutzer is the primary developer of BIFI.

Emilie E. Godwin, Ph.D., LPC, MFT: Assistant Professor and Director of Psychotherapy and Family Services at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU), Medical College of Virginia Campus. Dr. Godwin is a Marriage and Family Therapist specializing in whole family healing after TBI. The BIFI is a mainstay in her clinical practice, teaching curriculums, and lines of past and current research. Dr. Godwin has published a number of peer-reviewed journal articles and book chapters and regularly speaks at family and professional gatherings on the topic of TBI and the family.
