

Creating a secure password

Simple tips that will help you create strong and memorable passwords.

Method 1: Double Up

To develop a simple password that can easily be remembered, use one word twice.

Vacation2Vacation2 this is strong 18 character password

VacAtion2&VacAtion2 in this example, we have changed a few letters to uppercase and added the "&" character creating an even stronger password

Method 2: Use Phrases

Use the first letter and numbers from a memorable phrase.

My son was born in 2005 and his name is Jacob

Resulting password: **Mswbi2005ahniJ** or **Mswbi2005&hniJ**

This is a strong password. To make it stronger, use a generic phrase.

The Toronto Maple Leafs won the Stanley Cup in 1967!

Resulting Password: **TTMLwtSCi1967!**

This is a very strong password.

Method 3: Reusable base password with site specific add-ons

Create a memorable base password and add some characters to the end that are specific to the websites you use.

&thisismypw4: **C2C** and this is my password for connect2care
&thisismypw4: **FB** For Facebook, all you change is the last 2 characters
&thisismypw4: **TD** Using our standard method, this would be your password for your TD banking site
