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Do you have experience or expertise with accessible transportation and/or pedestrian navigation for people with disabilities?

Consider participating in a study about youth's experiences in navigating as a pedestrian, public transportation, or getting a driver's license.

What is this study about?

We want to understand your experiences as a pedestrian, navigating public transportation and/or learning to drive and obtaining a license.

Who can participate?

We are looking for:

- Youth with a physical disability, vision impairments OR autism who have experience travelling independently (either as a pedestrian, through public transit or holding a driver's license), aged 14-21 OR
- Parents of youth meeting the criteria above OR
- Clinicians with at least 1 year of experience / expertise in transportation or pedestrian related issues OR
- Community stakeholders (e.g., transit drivers, policy and other decision-makers with expertise in accessible transportation or pedestrian access)

What's involved?

Participants will be asked to take part in:

- 2-hour focus group (online) to share experiences and expertise on solutions to enhance accessible transportation and pedestrian access of young people with disabilities

What are the risks and benefits of participating?

- A benefit of participating includes helping us to learn about the challenges that youth experience regarding transportation and to develop solutions to address them.
