Do you have a sibling with special

needs? Consider participating in our research study and give us your feedback on a group-based peer support program for youth siblings of clients with special needs.

What is this study about?

• i-SibworkS is an online peer support group program led by clinicians to serve the mental health needs of siblings of children and youth with special needs.

Who can participate?

We are looking for:

- Youth between the ages of 6-16
- Siblings of children receiving services at Kinark or Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital
- English speaking
- Have no developmental disabilities
- Willing to participate in weekly sessions
- Access to a reliable internet connection

What's involved?

- Eight weeks of intervention delivered online through the video conferencing platform *Zoom*.
- Participants will complete a questionnaires on social life and emotion, stress and behavior routine. Parents of participants will also be asked to complete questionnaires in two of the eight sessions.

- Some participants may feel uncomfortable being in a group setting or sharing their feedback in the exit interview.
