COVID-19 testing service

In partnership with SickKids, Holland Bloorview now has a COVID-19 testing service for children with medical complexity and children with developmental conditions who cannot be served in their community and up to two (2) family members, such as family caregivers and/or siblings.

- An appointment is required to access the service and can be made by calling 416-419-4623. The line is open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. seven days a week, staffed by Holland Bloorview and SickKids staff.
- Appointments are available at SickKids during daytime hours (Monday to Friday and Sunday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.) or at Holland Bloorview during some evening hours (Monday and Wednesday, 5 p.m. to 9 p.m.) and Saturdays, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- The testing swab can be taken inside a vehicle or tent outside (SickKids) or in an indoor setting (Holland Bloorview).

Government of Ontario

Apply for Support for Learners funding

Parents and guardians will receive a one-time payment of \$200 for each child up to age 12, or \$250 for each child or youth up to age 21 with special needs. Deadline February 8, 2021

NOTE: The Support for Learners program will be expanded to students ages 13 to grade 12, including students who are in secondary school that are over 18. Applications will open on January 11, 2021. Details on eligibility and how to apply will be posted on the government of Ontario website.
