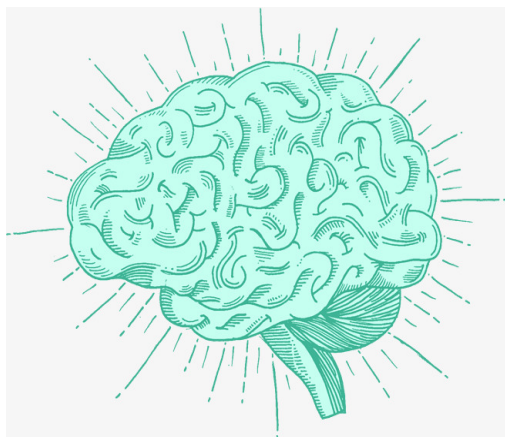

Are you an Ontario elementary school teacher or pre-service teacher? We would love your feedback on an eLearning module.

Consider participating in our research study to evaluate an eLearning module for educators about Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) (*Teach-ABI*).

What is this study about?

- *Teach-ABI* is an eLearning module created for educators about pediatric acquired brain injury. The objective is to raise Ontario educators' awareness and knowledge of ABI and promote positive outcomes for children with ABI in the education system.

Who can participate?

- We are looking to recruit professionals who are certified by the Ontario College of Teachers or are enrolled in an Ontario Teacher's College. Eligible professionals should be working, or in training to work, as an elementary school educator.

What's involved?

- Participants will be asked to work through the module and complete questionnaires prior to and immediately after finishing the module. A small group of participants will be asked to provide further feedback in an interview so the research team can better understand their experience with the module. All participants will also be sent a short survey two months after their first study session. Participation is expected to take approximately 2 hours.

Potential Benefits?

- Your feedback will help us improve the eLearning module for elementary school educators.
