Bridging to Adulthood Tips: Dental Finding a dentist for adults with disabilities

Dental care in adulthood:

Seeing a dentist regularly is important for health and wellbeing.

How do I find an adult dentist?

We recommend **speaking with your current dental professional** to see if they can continue to see you/your child as an adult. Or, they might have suggestions for where to go **in your community**.

How do I pay for adult dental services?

Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) – Dental Benefits	You might be eligible for Dental Benefits paid by the government if you receive ODSP. Talk to your case worker. You must make sure the dentist you choose accepts ODSP Dental Benefits. <u>https://www.mcss.gov.on.ca/en/mcss/programs/social/odsp/income_support/o_dsp_dental.aspx</u>
Other government dental programs	There are other government programs that may help cover the cost of basic dental care for people that meet the specific eligibility criteria. <u>https://www.oda.ca/visiting-the-dentist/government-dental-programs/</u>
Extended health benefits plan	You might have dental coverage through a workplace or post-secondary education institution benefits plan.
Affordable clinics	Some dental facilities offer lower cost options for people with financial need. <u>www.211Ontario.ca</u> or 1 877-330-3213
Out of pocket	Some people pay for dental services with their own money.
