

Clarification Strategies What to do when I don't understand my child

- Say that you don't understand. Don't pretend that you do.
- Repeat what you think you did understand.
- Encourage the individual to keep trying.
- Ask them to tell you the topic (by using a topic board or other quick technique).
- Ask them to start spelling it (first letter cueing) if they are able to do this. If not, always have an alphabet display available for modeling and ongoing teaching.

Ask them to:

- Slow down
- Say it in a different way
- Tell you more
- Show you (by acting it out or pointing to something)

Try to understand the topic by asking questions.

- What is it about?
- Who is it about?
- Where did it happen?
- When did it happen?

Offer choices:

- Do you want to play or read?
- Is it milk or juice?
