Help us learn more about your experiences!

What does “racialized” mean?

A “racialized” person is someone who identifies themselves as a “person of colour”, non-White or non-Caucasian.

What is the study about?

We are interested in learning about your experiences with a disability and the challenges you’ve faced in accessing (or providing) healthcare resources and services.

Who can participate?

- Youth living with a disability in Ontario who identify as racialized
- Healthcare provider (based in Ontario) serving racialized youth with disabilities

What’s involved?

- One 1- to 1.5-hour interview (in person or via Zoom)
- One art and/or photo-taking activity (no artistic talent needed; supplies will be provided)
- Total time commitment: 3 to 5 hours

Potential Benefits?

- Have your artwork displayed in a public mural
- Raise important issues around being a racialized person with a disability
- Be a part of the process of change within the healthcare system

Potential Risks?

- Potentially uncomfortable discussions around emotional content
