Entry to School (ETS) programs are free of charge, and available to families with children who are eligible for kindergarten or grade 1 and have not yet entered school. An invitation for the ETS program is sent by the OAP to eligible families. This program includes two parts. The first part is a six-month, group-based, skill-building program, focused on helping children develop school-readiness skills in six key areas. The second part provides your child with individual transition supports as they enter school.

<u>Urgent Response Service (URS)</u> is free of charge and provides short-term service for children or youth who are currently experiencing an urgent need. Service is intended to prevent a crisis or reduce the risk of harm to shelf, others or property.

Core Clinical Services funding is based on a child or youth's individual needs. Funding may be used for applied behaviour analysis (ABA), speech-language pathology, occupational therapy and/or mental health services. Children and youth will be invited to enter core clinical services in the order that they registered for the Ontario Autism Program. After you accept your invitation, an AccessOAP care coordinator will guide you through the process to determine your support needs and funding for core clinical services and supports.
