The symbol beside the name of the funding source helps you to sort through eligibility, based on age. Here is a table to show you what the symbols mean:

| Symbol* | Meaning |

| □ | This funding source is meant to support children between the ages of 0-12 |
| △ | This funding source is meant to support teens between the ages of 13-17 |
| ☆ | This funding source is meant to support adults 18 years of age and older |
| ❖ | This funding source supports people of many/all ages |
| ∞ | This funding source supports caregivers (parents, siblings, grandparents, etc.) |

Municipal Government Programs (City of Toronto)

| Child Care Fee Subsidy □∞ | |
|--|---|
| <p><u>Description</u></p> <p>A Child Care Fee Subsidy helps a family with the cost of licensed childcare. There is a waitlist, so apply as soon as possible. You can apply as soon as you know you are pregnant or expecting a child through adoption. For more information follow the QR code, call 416-338-8888, or if you receive Ontario Works, contact your Ontario Works caseworker to apply.</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <p>A family who needs help with the cost of licensed childcare for their children (up to 12 years old) and meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your family lives in Toronto or is moving to Toronto • Each parent/guardian is either employed, looking for work, in school or planning to go to school, or if you or your child has an extra support need • Each parent/guardian has submitted their most recent Income Tax Return • If you are a new immigrant to Canada this year or if you are under 18 years of age, you may apply without your most recent Tax Return |
| Rent-Geared-to-Income Subsidy ❖∞ | |
| <p><u>Description</u></p> <p>Rent-Geared-to-Income (RGI), or subsidized housing, is made available by the City to make rent affordable for households.</p> <p>The number of people in need of subsidized housing exceeds the number of units available, meaning that wait times for an applicant to receive housing are significant. You are encouraged to consider RGI housing as a long-term housing plan, not an immediate solution to housing needs or emergency situations. For more information follow the QR code or call 416-338-8888.</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <p>To be eligible for Rent-Geared-to-Income (RGI) housing, applicants must meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At least one member of the household is 16 years or older and can live independently, with or without support services • Household income does not exceed the Housing Income Limits (HILs) • Total household assets are within Asset Limit requirements • Acceptable status documents include one of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Canadian Citizen card ○ permanent resident or proof of application for permanent resident ○ proof of status as a refugee claimant or Convention refugee |

Toronto Welcome Policy ❖ ∞

Description

Welcome Policy is a recreation fee subsidy to help Toronto residents access recreation programs. Eligible individuals and families will receive an annual financial credit that can be used towards the cost of all FitnessTO memberships and fitness multi-use passes, in addition to registered recreation programs such as lessons, camps and after-school care programs offered by the City of Toronto. Eligibility

- To be an Applicant (Main Contact on Application Form), you must be at least 18 years of age or older
- Applicants and their families must:
- Live in the City of Toronto
 - Have a before tax family income of less than the amounts listed on the website
 - See website for additional information on Ontario Works (OW), ODSP, and ACSD recipients

Provincial Government Programs (Government of Ontario)

Ontario Electricity Support Program (OESP) ❖

Description

OESP provides an ongoing monthly credit directly on qualified consumers' electricity bills. For more information follow the QR code, call 1-800-855-1155 or email

Eligibility

- Household size and income meet certain levels listed on the website
- It's also available to people living in condominiums or apartments (multi-unit buildings and sometimes townhomes) where each unit has an individual meter and the resident's electricity bill comes from a company other than their utility, a Unit Sub-Meter Provider or USMP

Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) ❖

Description
If you're behind on your electricity or natural gas bill and face having your service disconnected, you may qualify for emergency financial help through the Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP). Eligibility


- Household size and income meet certain levels listed on the website

Assistance to Children with Severe Disabilities (ACSD) □△

Description
If you are a parent caring for a child with a severe disability, you may be able to receive financial support through ACSD. Depending on the income and size of the family, the program may provide between \$25 and \$646 a month to help with costs, such as:

- travel to doctors' appointments, hospitals and other appointments related to the child's disability
- special shoes and clothes
- parental relief such as respite
- wheelchairs and other assistive devices, including repairs
- hearing aids and batteries
- prescription drugs
- dental/vision care, including eyeglasses

Eligibility

- A parent or a legal guardian whose child:
 - is under 18 years of age,
 - lives at home,
 - and has a severe disability
- total household income is \$76,200 or less

Assistive Devices Program (ADP) ❖

Description

Through the Assistive Devices Program (ADP), we help people with long-term physical disabilities pay for customized equipment, like wheelchairs and hearing aids.

- The ADP also helps cover the cost of specialized supplies, such as those used with ostomies.
- ADP covers 75% of the cost for equipment and supplies. For these items, they are billed directly by the supplier, and you pay 25% when you buy the item.

Eligibility

To qualify, you must:

- be an Ontario resident
 - have a valid Ontario health card
 - have a disability requiring the equipment or supplies for six months or longer
- ADP does not consider your income

Exceptional Access Program (EAP) ❖

Description

The Exceptional Access Program (EAP) facilitates patient access to drugs not funded on the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB)* Formulary, or where no listed alternative is available. In order to receive coverage, the patient must be eligible to receive benefits under the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) program. Eligibility

- Selected drug-specific criteria used in the consideration of EAP requests are available on the ministry website
- For a drug to be considered for funding, the EAP reimbursement criteria must always be met
 - Full list of reimbursement criteria for some drugs considered through the EAP is available on their website

Healthy Smiles Ontario □△

Description

Healthy Smiles Ontario is a government-funded dental program that provides free preventive, routine, and emergency dental services for children and youth 17 years old and under from low-income households. The program includes regular visits to a licensed dental provider and covers the costs of eligible treatment. For more information follow the QR code or call 1-844-296-6306



Eligibility

Children are automatically enrolled in the program if:

- they receive assistance under: Temporary Care Assistance or Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities
- they or their family receive: Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support

You can apply for your children if they:

- are 17 years of age and under
- live in Ontario
- come from a household with an income equal to or less than the levels in the table listed on the website

Northern Health Travel Grants ∞❖

Description

The Northern Health Travel Grant (NHTG) program offers financial assistance to Northern Ontario residents who need to travel long-distances for specialized medical services or procedures at a ministry-funded health care facility.

- An applicant must travel at least 100 kilometres (km) one-way to access the closest medical specialist, or ministry funded health care facility services that are not available locally.

Eligibility


- You are an OHIP-insured Ontario resident on the date of treatment
- Your primary place of residence is in the districts of Algoma, Cochrane, Kenora, Manitoulin, Nipissing, Parry Sound, Rainy River, Sudbury, Thunder Bay, or Timiskaming.
- You have obtained a referral from a Northern Ontario health care provider
- You have been referred to a medical specialist who is certified by The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC)
- you are referred for a ministry funded health care facility-based procedure under the *Health Insurance Act* performed by a provider in the facility
- the nearest specialist or approved health care facility able to provide the type of care you require in Ontario is at least 100 kilometres from your area of residence.

Ontario Cleft Lip and Palate/Craniofacial Dental Program □△

Description
The Ontario Cleft Lip and Palate/Craniofacial Dental Program covers up to 75% of the pre-approved dental specialist treatment costs not covered by private dental insurance.

- Dental infant orthopaedics
- Orthodontic treatment
- Some restorative dentistry
- Dental prosthetics
- Dental implants and oral surgery not funded by OHIP

The program will not cover the cost of regular dental check-ups, some procedures that are not deemed eligible and long-term follow-up care. For more information follow the QR code.




Eligibility
To be eligible for funding an individual must be:

- A resident of Ontario in possession of a valid OHIP number, and
- Diagnosed as having a cleft lip and/or palate, a craniofacial anomaly or other severe dental dysfunction, and
- have sufficient residual craniofacial growth necessary to achieve the maximum potential benefit from a single course of treatment

To determine eligibility for financial assistance through the program, an individual must contact, or be referred to, one of the designated centres for a screening assessment.

Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) ☆❖

Description
Income support - Financial assistance to help with the costs of basic needs, like food, clothing and shelter. Income support also includes drug coverage and vision care, for clients and their eligible family members.
Employment supports - Supports to help clients with disabilities find and keep a job and advance their careers.

Eligibility
To qualify for **ODSP income support**, you must:

- be at least 18 years old
- be an Ontario resident
- have assets no greater than the limits set out in the program
- be in financial need
- meet the program’s definition of a person with a disability, or be a member of a Prescribed Class

Ontario Drug Benefit ❖ ∞

Description

The Ontario Drug Benefit program covers most of the cost of approximately 5,000 prescription drug products. It also helps you pay for:

- allergy shots and EpiPen®
- some products used in monitoring and testing for diabetes
- some prescribed over-the-counter drugs under specific circumstances
- some nutrition products
- some drugs used in treatment of HIV/AIDS,
- some drugs used in palliative care
- Some drugs to help quit smoking.

Eligibility

You will qualify for the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) program when you turn **65 years old**.

Some will qualify before the age of 65 if:

- living in a long-term care home, a home for special care, or Community Home for Opportunity
- under the age of 24 and not covered by a private insurance plan
- receiving professional home and community care services
- receiving benefits from Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support Program
- enrolled in the Trillium Drug Program

Passport program △ ☆ ∞

Description

Passport provides funding for services and supports so adults with a developmental disability can:

- take part in community classes or recreational programs
- develop work, volunteer, and daily life skills
- hire a support worker
- create their own life plans (this is called person-directed planning) to reach their goals

Eligibility

The Passport program is for people with a developmental disability who are 18-years-old or older and:


- need support to participate in the community while they are still in school
- have left school and are living on their own, with family or independently in a supportive living arrangement

Special Services at Home (SSAH) □△∞

Description
SSAH provides funding to buy services and supports that help parents with caring for their child, or that support the child to join activities at home and in the community.
The goal of the SSAH program is to assist children with physical and/or developmental disabilities and their families to do what's important to them. This includes providing:

- support for the child to participate in day to-day activities
- assistance for the child to participate in activities that support their growth and development
- support for parents/main caregivers (such as respite services)

Eligibility
To be eligible for Special Services at Home (SSAH), a child must:

- need extra support, beyond what is expected for their age, because of a physical and/or developmental disability, so that they can take part in daily activities at home and in the community
- be a resident of Ontario and legally entitled to live in Canada
- be under 18 years old
- live at home with their main caregiver or live separately from their main caregiver without support from other government-funded out-of-home (residential) services

The Trillium Drug Program (TDP) ❖



Description
The Trillium Drug Program covers the cost of about 5,000 prescription drugs that are currently available through the Ontario Drug Benefit Program, and about 1,000 drug products upon meeting specified criteria through the Exceptional Access Program.

Eligibility
To qualify for the TDP, you must:




- not already qualify for Ontario Drug Benefit (e.g. you're under 65 years old and not enrolled in a program such as Ontario Works)
- have a valid Ontario health card
- live in Ontario
- do not have an insurance plan that pays for 100% of your drugs
- Spend about 4% or more of your after-tax household income on prescription drug costs

| Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP) ❖ | |

| <p><u>Description</u></p> <p>A registered disability savings plan (RDSP) is a savings plan that is intended to help an individual who is approved to receive the disability tax credit (DTC) to save for their long-term financial security. You can open an RDSP at a local bank.</p> <p>For more information follow the QR code or call 1-800-959-8281</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <p>You can designate an individual as beneficiary if the individual:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • is approved for the DTC • has a valid social insurance number (SIN) • is a resident in Canada when the plan is entered into • is under the age of 60 |
| Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) ❖ | |
| <p><u>Description</u></p> <p>The Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) is helping make the cost of dental care more affordable for eligible Canadian residents. For more information follow the QR code, call 1-833-537-4342, or visit any Service Canada Centre</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Seniors aged 65 and over • Children under the age of 18 • Adults with a valid Disability Tax Credit certificate • Do not have access to dental insurance • Adjusted family net income is less than \$90,000 • Canadian resident for tax purposes • Filled a tax return for the previous year |

| <p><u>Description</u></p> <p>If you support a spouse or common-law partner, or a dependent with a physical or mental impairment, the Canada caregiver credit (CCC) is a non-refundable tax credit that may be available to you.</p> <p>For more information follow the QR code</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You may be able to claim the CCC if you support <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ your spouse or common-law partner with a physical or mental impairment. ○ your or your spouse's or common-law partner's child or grandchild ○ your or your spouse's or common-law partner's parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, niece, or nephew (if resident in Canada at any time in the year) • An individual is considered to depend on you for support if they rely on you to regularly and consistently provide them with some or all of the basic necessities of life, such as food, shelter and clothing. |
| Canada Child Benefit (CCB) ∞ | |
| <p><u>Description</u></p> <p>The Canada child benefit (CCB) is a tax-free monthly payment made to eligible families to help them with the cost of raising children under 18 years of age. The CCB might include the child disability benefit and any related provincial and territorial programs.</p> <p>For more information follow the QR code or call 1-800-387-1193</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You live with a child who is under 18 years of age • You are primarily responsible for the care and upbringing of the child • You are a resident of Canada for tax purposes • You or your spouse or common-law partner must be any if the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A Canadian citizen ○ A permanent resident ○ A protected person ○ a temporary resident who has lived in Canada for the previous 18 months, and who has a valid permit in the 19th month ○ an individual who is registered, or entitled to be registered under the Indian Act |

| <p><u>Description</u> The child disability benefit is a tax-free monthly payment made to families who care for a child under age 18 with a severe and prolonged impairment in physical or mental functions. For more information follow the QR code or call 1-800-387-1193</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u> To get the child disability benefit:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You must be eligible for the Canada child benefit • Your child must be eligible for the disability tax credit <p>If you are already getting the Canada child benefit for your child who is eligible for the disability tax credit, you do not need to apply for the child disability benefit. You will get it automatically.</p> |
| Disability Supports Deduction ❖ | |
| <p><u>Description</u> Individuals who have an impairment in physical or mental functions and have paid for certain medical expenses can, under certain conditions, claim the disability supports deduction. For more information follow the QR code</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u> If you have an impairment in physical or mental functions, you may be able to deduct the expenses that you paid in the year so that you could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work • go to school • do research for which you received a grant <p>There is also an online list of eligible expenses for the disability supports deduction, and any certification from a medical practitioner that may be needed.</p> |
| Disability Tax Credit ❖ | |
| <p><u>Description</u> The disability tax credit (DTC) is a non-refundable tax credit that helps persons with disabilities or their supporting persons reduce the amount of income tax they may have to pay. For more information follow the QR code or call 1-800-959-8281</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You may be eligible for the DTC if a medical practitioner certifies that you have a severe and prolonged impairment in 1 of the categories, significant limitations in 2 or more categories, or receive therapy to support a vital function. • Please see the categories on their website |

| Eligible medical expenses you can claim on your return ❖ ∞ | |

| <p><u>Description</u> You can claim medical expenses on your tax return. Generally, you can claim all amounts paid, even if they were not paid in Canada. For more information follow the QR code or call 1-800-959-8281</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u> Please see website for list of items that you can claim on your return – this can include therapy, travel costs, wheelchairs, and renovations. | Excise gasoline tax refund ❖ ∞ | |

| GST/HST Information ❖ ∞ | |
| <p><u>Description</u> There are goods and services used by persons with disabilities that are exempt supplies or zero-rated supplies for purposes of the goods and services tax/harmonized sales tax (GST/HST). This means you will not pay GST/HST on these goods and services. For more information follow the QR code</p>  | <p><u>Eligibility</u> Goods and services that could potentially be claimed include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medical and disability-related services, such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Home care services ○ Care and supervision services ○ Recreational programs • Specially equipped motor vehicles |

Home Buyer's Plan ❖ ∞

Description

The Home Buyers' Plan (HBP) is a program that allows you to withdraw up to \$35,000 in a calendar year from your registered retirement savings plans (RRSPs) to buy or build a qualifying home for yourself or for a related person with a disability.

Eligibility

- You must be considered a first-time home buyer.
- You or the specified disabled person must have a written agreement to buy or build a qualifying home at the time of your withdrawal.
- You must be a resident of Canada at the time of your withdrawal from your RRSPs under the HBP
- You or the specified disabled person must intend to occupy the qualifying home that you are buying or building as your principal place of residence no later than one year after buying or building it

Home and Car Modifications

Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation – On-Reserve Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program ❖ ∞

Description

The On-Reserve Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program (RRAP) provides financial assistance to First Nations and First Nation members to cover the costs of major repairs and adaptations for their homes.
